<u>English</u>	<u>Topic</u> <u>Anglo-Saxons</u>	<u>RE</u> <u>Lenten Focus</u> <u>'Turning over a new leaf'</u>
<p>An verb is an action or a doing word like run, play or build. An <b>adverb</b> is a word that <u>describes</u> a verb. <i>Try to remember it being the adjective of the verb = <b>ad+verb</b>.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">He ate his breakfast <b>quickly</b>.</p> <p>The word <b>quickly</b> is an adverb. It tells us how he ate (<i>the verb</i>) his breakfast.</p> <p>Complete the adverb activity sheet – ask an adult at home to help if you need to.</p> 	<p>On Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> March year 3 and 4 will be taking part in an Anglo – Saxon workshop run by an outside agency. In preparation for the day we are asking the children to make a sword and a helmet to wear and use on the day.</p> <p>You can make your sword and helmet out of any material you want to. Be as creative as you can.</p> <p><b><u>Please make sure your name is written clearly on your sword and helmet.</u></b></p>	<p>Using the template of a leaf provided, On one side write or draw something that you are sorry for. Then turn the leaf over, because if you are truly sorry, then God will forgive you and it can be forgotten. On the other side of the leaf, write or draw something good that you can do this Lent. Perhaps it is something simple like keeping your room tidy or helping at home. Or maybe it is something you can do better in the future like trying not to argue or being a good friend. In taking part in this activity, you are turning over a new leaf and putting any bad things behind you.</p>
