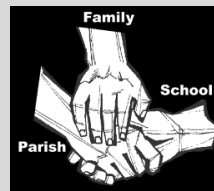


Discipleship – Summer 2 2018

Religious Education

Key Idea: Discipleship

This framework of learning is intended as the final resource for the Summer Term in the academic year 2017/2018. It completes study of the Gospel of Mark by examining one of his strongest themes: discipleship. Building on the work of the previous unit, this resource picks up the actions of the disciples in Mark's Gospel as we identify what it is that Jesus asks of those how follow him.

Key Dates

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF THE LORD (3 June)
 On this feast we give thanks to God for the gift of Jesus in the form of bread and wine.
 THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS (8 June)
 On this day we remember how much Jesus loves us all.
 SS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES (29 June)
 We celebrate the lives of these important saints who helped establish the Christian Church.

Attitudes and Spiritual Dispositions

Spiritual Outcomes: *It is hoped that pupils will develop:*

- An openness to following the life and teaching of Jesus
- An awareness of the way that people around them live as contemporary followers

- An attitude of hope in responding to the challenges of being a disciple

Activities to try at home
