Write as many different adverbials of time that you can think of (later, then, afterwards etc). Flick through a few story books to see if you can spot some more of these time words and add them to the list.</p> <p>Now write about your day, BUT you are only allowed to use the phrase 'and then' or the word 'then' ONCE? How many adverbials of time can you use?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English</u> Autumn setting</p> <p>Take a walk (this could be your walk home from school). Take a look at your surroundings. What can you see? Smell? Hear?</p> <p>Write a description of your setting. Use as many interesting adjectives as you can e.g. Muddy brown leaves crunched under my spotty wellies as I saw juicy conkers falling rapidly from the trees.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>RE</u>  <u>Family</u></p> <p>Using the scripture from <i>God's Story 3</i> page 69 (see sheet), design a family tree for Jesus. This can be done by hand or on the computer.</p>
