LESSON ONE

Pupils learn about where money comes from and making choices when spending money

Pupils • understand that people get money in different ways (earn, win, find, presents, pocket money, borrow, benefits) • recognise that people make choices about what to buy • understand that they may not always be able to have all the things they want

LESSON TWO

Pupils learn about saving money and how to keep it safe

Pupils • understand why people might want to save their money • can say how it feels to save for something you really want • recognise where money is stored to keep it safe and some places are safer than others

LESSON THREE

Pupils learn about the different jobs people do

Pupils • know that there are a range of jobs that people can do • recognise that both men and women are able to do a range of jobs • understand that having a job means people can earn money
